- A. Approval of Financial Reports Nancy Thompson, VP of Business Services

VIII. DISCUSSION ITEMS

- A. KS Board of Regents Performance Agreements Lisa Kirmer, VP of Student Services
 This is a summary of the Performance Agreements for the 3-year period of 2014-15-16. Six indicators were chosen to be evaluated.
 - KBOR specific Indicators:
 - o Increase first to second year retention rates of college ready cohort.
 - o Increase the number of certificates and degrees awarded.
 - o Increase the wages of students hired.

All three indicators increased from the baseline, which is directional improvement.

- Institution-specific Indicators:
 - Increase the percentage of students completing a remedial math course who successfully complete a 100 level math course.
 - o Increase the number of students completing a GED who enroll.
 - o Increase the number of Hispanic students who complete a certificate, technical certificate or AAS degree.

The remedial math indicator and number of Hispanic students both increased. The number of students completing a GED decreased, possibly due to students no longer being required to prepare for the GED at centers such as the Adult Education Center.

- B. College Update President Dean Hollenbeck
 - Enrollment is holding as classes began today.
 - The Student Services remodel will be completed by the second week of September.
 - Expansion of the welding building is needed.
 - Bryan Crouch and Dean Hollenbeck visited Fort Riley last week. A luncheon for soldiers and their families is being planned by FHTC, RDA, Mainstreet, Lyon County Commissioners and Chamber of Commerce. This luncheon is planned as a recruitment for workforce in Lyon County.
