- Cash flow is strong largely due to CARES Act funds for lost revenue and discharge of student debt and receiving Maintenance of Effort (MOE) funds from the State
- Accounts Receivable balance was reduced due to receiving Financial Aid funds for the Fall
- Accounts Payable balance is showing expenses from last fiscal year which have been covered within current year grant funds



- Monthly expenses are higher than this time last year. Majority of the difference is because of
  equipment expenses through the Maintenance of Effort (MOE) funds from the State.
- Kansas Promise Act received additional \$40,000 in revenue from the State.
- Lyon County Commission Grant granted \$60,000 from the Lyon County Commission to be used for the Division of Technology
- Student funding will be distributed to UG students enrolled this week each UG student will receive \$160 per credit hour. Will use \$40,000 from institutional funds as well.
