As part of the Kansas Board of Regents' "Building a Future" strategic plan, Kansas-based organizations can hire college students for fully funded short-term, paid, professional projects. Flint Hills Technical College is a participant in the Kansas Micro-Internship Program. All Micro-Internship opportunities are posted on the Parker Dewey platform. For Employers:

The Micro-Internship Program is a unique opportunity for your business to connect with an FHTC student via a free (up to \$500) Micro-Internship. Micro-Internships can help you or others on your team with various professional tasks. Most projects are completed remotely and are typically due within a month of kick-off to give you immediate, on-demand support.

To get started:

1. Post your professional project on Parker Dewey.

2. Select an undergraduate student enrolled at Flint Hills Technical. While the project is free to you, this fully-funded program means every student gets paid fairly for their work, but given the nature of this program, students are not your employees or contractors.

For Students:

With the Micro-Internship Program, you can work on opportunities with organizations throughout Kansas and beyond while demonstrating your skills, exploring career and developing paths, vour professional network. These paid opportunities typically take 5 to 40 hours to complete, are usually remote, and typically kick off right away.

To get started:

1. Complete the Agile Work Profiler and upload a PDF of your results into the Documents section of your Parker Dewey profile.

2. Create your account on Parker Dewey. Be sure to complete the Education section of your profile.

3. Apply to all projects that interest you. Kansas Micro-Internship Program projects will be listed first.
