Joey LeMay FHTC's 2022 Distinguished Alumni

Joey LeMay graduated from Flint Hills Technical College in 1996 from the Industrial Engineering Technology program. He worked at IBP/Tyson for five years while attending college. LeMay held several positions at Tyson, beginning as a Master Electrician then as a Maintenance Supervisor, supervising 22 employees for three years. During those three years as supervisor, he attended many leadership classes and courses, building his leadership skills.

In 1999, LeMay began his career at Simmons Pet Food as a Programmer/ Electrician, then as Maintenance Lead, Electrical Lead and later as the role of Corp. Controls Manager, which managed all electrical and controls projects for four plants. He then served as Project Manager, responsible for building a new 208,000 square foot production facility in Emporia. After the project was completed, he took the role of Senior Engineering Manager and oversaw all capital projects for eleven facilities with a total capital investment of projects ranging between \$50 and \$75 million a year. LeMay's current role at Simmons is Senior Director of Operations of Emporia Main.

LeMay is also active on many boards in the community including as a member of the FHTC Industrial Engineering Technology Program Advisory Committee, also serving as past president of the committee. He is on the Emporia Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors and involved in the Emporia Manufacturing Committee.
